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Rules and Regulations at Edgewater

This is the first in a series of monthly articles pertaining to the Rules and Regulations here at Edgewater. The rules and regulations are reviewed on an ongoing basis and updated as times change. The Board of Managers always appreciates suggestions but asks that any ideas be submitted in writing. This is *your* home, feel free to take an active role.

Some of the rules we'll only touch on briefly; others may have lengthy explanations.

The first thing I want to cover is complaints: **Complaints must be made in writing** (according to the Rules and Regulations). There are forms in the office.

Parking

- Owners and/or occupants are permitted to park <u>one vehicle in resident parking areas</u>. All other vehicles must be parked in the visitor and guest parking area. All vehicles registered as commercial or with commercial advertising or lettering must be parked in visitors and guest parking areas. Tractors, trailers and large trucks must park in board designated parking area.
- All owners and occupants are required to have a parking sticker or tag on their vehicle at all times. stickers are to be placed on the left rear side window of the vehicle. Guest tags may not be used for more than 30 days.
- Vehicles left running must not be left unattended.
- Each unit will be allowed a total of three vehicles on Edgewater property. "Vehicles" include cars, trucks, boats, and all other recreational vehicles. Residents desiring to have additional vehicles will be charged an annual fee as follows:
 - o Vehicle 4: \$250
 - o Vehicle 5: \$400
 - o All additional: \$500 per vehicle
- Any extra vehicles (more than three) must be parked in an area designated by Edgewater Administration.
- All vehicles must be registered and insured.
- All RVs and motor homes must be parked in the overflow parking area on the west road.

Some buildings have limited parking. Residents need to exercise good judgment and leave room for others to park. Parking at an angle or using two spots only makes it more difficult for others. Be kind. Be considerate of your neighbors.
