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Highlights of March 28 Board of Managers Meeting

WWTP repairs will begin once parts get delivered.

A proposal from Leamer's Masonry and More Inc. to repair deterioration on an exterior wall, at G building, was voted on and approved at a cost of \$4,260.

The board approved a bid from Simpson Electric, LLC to perform electrical upgrades to the Maintenance Building, at a total cost of \$2,135.16.

The snow fence from the exit road area has been taken down and used to create a Doggy Park on the complex. Homeowners are reminded that they must continue to cleanup pet waste in this area and that they are responsible for their pets in the Doggy Park in the same manner as any other area of the complex.

The maintenance storage area will be cleaned up and organized by the maintenance crew.

It is time to start planning Spring cleanup and landscaping with the Beautification Committee. An employee will be assigned to begin with unit fronts and assist the beautification committee. All members are encouraged to contact Rick Clawson for any maintenance assistance needed by a committee member.

Board member, Kim Alonge, is in the process of setting up an Edgewater Condominium Facebook Group for homeowners and residents only.

The storage proposal request whereby homeowners requested to place Amish made storage sheds at the west end of the property, was denied based on advise from our attorney that approval may not be in compliance with the Declaration.

The board has received a total of three proposals for WiFi. The contract with Consolidated expires on March 31, 2020. The board will hold a work session to review and discuss the three proposals before the April meeting.

Handmade Cloth Face Masks

I, Janet Greene, Unit 904, have been making Cloth Face Masks to help prevent infection from Covid19. These are made with three layers of fabric, come in adult and children sizes and are completely washable/dryable. The masks can be used when the need arises to go out in public, such as the grocery store, etc. I do **caution** that they are **not** CDC approved masks, but they are better than no protection at all, per the CDC.

I have donated several to Absolut Care of Westfield, for health care workers to wear over their standard disposable masks, until N95 CDC approved masks arrive. In addition, I have made others for family, friends and a local bank that does not have a drive through window.
