

Edgewater Board of Managers Meeting Highlights—February 27, 2021

The Board of Managers meeting was held on February 27, 2021, at 11:00pm via Go to Meeting. Highlights of the meeting are:

- The Pool House key fob system will be installed soon and will be ready for the 2021 opening. Each unit will receive one key fob when pool season is upon us.
- The Lounge and Laundry room have been updated with a fresh coat of paint.
- New flooring installation in the Laundry Room is complete.
- Replacement of the N building deck will begin soon as Spring 2021 is approaching.
- Unexpected for 2021, the replacement of the F building deck will begin immediately following the N building deck.
- The Office siding and windows will be replaced with vinyl for easy maintenance and affordability and begin after the deck replacements are completed and the capital projects list is reviewed.
- Rules are being finalized for the Pool, Firepit and new key fob system. The rules will be ready for the openings, as needed.
- The Treasury Report noted Johnson, Mackowiak, and Associates completed a financial review for the year ending Dec. 31 and found we are in compliance with all applicable NY State HOA financial regulations and our accounting practices follow national guidelines.
- Mailbox cement pads will be replaced starting in the Spring of 2021.
- Resolution #1 of 2021, to acquire unit #605G, as stated by the ECA Bylaws, was adopted.
- A Capital Improvements project list will be developed and shared with the Board to track and prioritize capital projects listed for the next 5 years.
- Each Spring, an Arborist walks the property with Rick to look for damaged or diseased trees. Residents who have a concern about trees located near their unit, should contact Rick or any Board member.
- The next meeting will take place at 11:00 AM on Saturday, March 27th, via GoToMeeting.

Portobello Mushroom Fajitas

¹/₄ cup Homemade taco seasoning (or 2 tbsp store bought)
2 tbsp Olive oil
1 Lime juiced, ¹/₄ cup
1 ¹/₂ lbs Portobello mushrooms, cut into thick ³/₄-inch slices
1 Red onion, sliced
1 Red bell pepper, sliced
1 Orange bell pepper, sliced
1 Yellow bell pepper, sliced
Small flour tortillas
Guacamole
Cilantro

1. Preheat oven to 450°F.

2. In a large bowl make a marinade using the taco seasoning, olive oil and lime juice.

3. Toss the portobello mushrooms in the marinade until evenly coated.

4. Spread ingredients across an oiled baking pan and bake for 20 minutes. If you want to add some char to the mushrooms and veggies, broil for another 3 minutes.

5. Serve with warm tortillas, salsa, guacamole, avocado, and fresh cilantro.





Cilantro Lime Chicken Thighs

3 Ibs Chicken thighs, bloneless, skinless
⅓ cup Olive oil 6 Garlic cloves, minced
1 tbsp Honey
2 Limes, juice and zest
¼ cup Cilantro, finely minced
2 tbsp Chili powder
1 tsp Salt
½ tsp Pepper--

1. In a large bowl mix the olive oil, garlic, honey, zest and juice of limes, cilantro, chili powder, salt pepper and olive oil.

2. Add the chicken to the marinade, stir to coat well. Marinate for 15 minutes at room temperature or up to 2 hours covered in the refrigerator.

- 3. Heat a large cast iron pan, non-stick frying pan or a griddle over medium-high heat.
- 4. Add the chicken thighs in a single layer, so they are not touching.

5. Cook for 6 minutes on each side until the chicken thighs are cooked through, with an internal temperature of 165 degrees F. and no longer pink in the center.
